**Abstract:** A retired, United Methodist pastor, Stanley C. Brown and his wife, Ruth lived in several areas in Arizona. This collection is an accumulation of his work as a researcher, author, historian, teacher, and lecturer. It also includes his collection of photographs from research trips and other sources. Most of the papers are copies of his writings whether a lecture, a presentation, a column or a book. There are many transcripts of oral histories included in the collection, mostly from the Rim country and central Arizona. The collection also includes indexes of writings, oral histories, etc.

## Biographical History

Stanley Coleman Brown was born in Chicago, Illinois, May 6, 1928. He attended Beverly Hills Elementary School, University High School and Harvard School for Boys. Later, he



spent two years at Washington and Lee University in Virginia then transferred to Northwestern University in Illinois, where he earned a bachelor's degree in American history. Stan married Ruth Staffelbach at the end of his junior year. She had a degree in education from the National College of Education. Next, Mr. Brown went to Garrett Biblical Institute for his master's in theology. In 1958, he moved to Phoenix to serve in the Central Methodist Church. Then he went to Long Beach, and in 1972, he was transferred to the Catalina Methodist Church in Tucson, where he served for 20 years. Stan and Ruth have had a life-long interest in history. They built a cabin north of Payson in 1963, where he became the town historian. The Browns moved to Las Fuentes Village in Prescott in 2004. The couple has three children.

## Scope and Content Note

This collection contains many of Stanley Brown's writings, whether a lecture, a presentation, a column or a book. It also includes his collection of photographs from research trips and other sources. There are many transcripts of oral histories included in the collection, mostly from the Rim country and central Arizona. The collection also includes indexes of writings, oral histories, etc. Mr. Brown kept copies of many of his lectures and presentations that are included in the collection, including indexes.
